End of line for Indian Lakes

LAST DAYS Indian Lakes Resort will close at the end of the year, 12 years after a major renovation.

Just when it appeared the run of course closures was at an end with a slightly improved economy, word came last last month that the Indian Lakes Resort, a fixture in Bloomington since opening in 1965, would shutter its 27-hole golf complex at season's end.

The reason, the owners said, is financial. Despite a stylish renovation in 2004 by **Rick Jacobsen** that cut the complex from 36 to 27 holes, adding a practice facility and upgrading the playability, the golf portion of the 223-acre complex has lost money year after year, with the accumulated loss since 2011 about \$5 million.

"There is no viable financial path forward in which

either the golf course or conference center continue operations; they must close," said First Hospitality Group president **Robert Habeeb**.

The 30,000-square foot conference center will be shuttered on Dec. 15, replaced by 12,000 square feet of meeting space, coinciding with a \$4 million renovation of the hotel set to finish in 2017.

Additionally, Hilton is ending its deal with the owners, and it's believed DoubleTree will be taking over as the brand. (Hilton continues to operate the Oak Brook Hills Resort, where the Willow Crest course is thriving.)

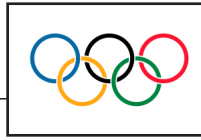

How to make Olympic golf work

The Olympic men's golf tournament is in full swing as this is typed, and having finally seen the finished product, the following conclusion can be drawn:

It's a great four days if you like a European Tour weekend without a sponsor and even sparser galleries than usual.

Leave aside Gil Hanse's course for a moment. It's certainly playable but hardly compelling on television. It may be perfect for the new golfers who come along – if they come along – in Rio de Janeiro. That would leave a lasting impact better than most Olympic venues do.

The tournament itself is just another tournament. The argument can be made that the four major championships are as well, in that they're 72 holes of stroke play, but shouldn't the Olympic golf championship be unique?

Unlike 1904, the last time golf was in the Olympics, this time there was only an individual competition. Why not go all in and have a team tournament as well?

The number of teams would depend on who qualified individually. If a country had three or more players, then they're a team. If they have four (the maximum), then the top three scores every day would count.

And there's a way to separate the team and individual tournaments. Use the format for the Western Amateur, the most grueling tournament in golf – eight rounds in five days.

The stroke play portion, with 72 holes, and

36 on the final day, would determine the team title and qualify 16 players for the match-play showdowns to decide the individual title.

That would be different for the pros, and worth watching. Imagine – if everyone showed up – a championship match between Rory McIlroy and Jordan Spieth for the gold medal. Or Jason Day and Martin Kaymer. (There would also be a third-place match for the bronze.)

Given how the Ryder Cup sets hearts beating faster, individual match play with an Olympic title on the line would be even more compelling.

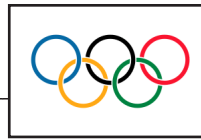
The same format would be used for the women's tournament, of course. Then you might have Lydia Ko and Brooke Henderson, players who missed the International Crown because they didn't have enough compatriots for a team, going head-to-head for Olympic gold.

It would be great if these changes could be made for the Tokyo Olympics in 2020. First,

of course, fingers of golf brass from the R&A, USGA and the big tours are crossed for the renewal of the sport beyond 2020 by the International Olympic Committee. That topic comes up for discussion next year. The absence of the top four men in the rankings might not mean that much if the fortnight in progress produces decent winners and close competition. A few more people on hand wouldn't hurt either.

Golf in the Olympics won't get more people in the U.S. to play golf. It likely won't make the game more popular where it's established elsewhere in the world either. But maybe, down the line, someone from India or Mongolia will happen along, take an Olympic medal, and turn the rest of his country on to the Royal and Ancient game. That wouldn't be all bad.

And if the PGA Tour can figure out how not to kick the John Deere Classic to the scheduling curb next time, so much the better.

Thin field? Blame it on Rio

It seemed like a good idea at the time. Bring golf back into the Olympics for the first time since 1904, then Glen Echo Country Club in St. Louis hosted team and individual competitions for men.

What could possibly go wrong? The answers to that question are known now. First came the difficulty in construction of the course designed by Gil Hanse and Amy Alcott in Rio de Janeiro.

Next came the discovery of the mosquito-transmitted Zika virus in Rio, which prompted

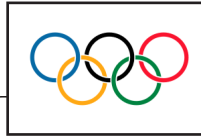

an exodus of notables from the male side of the game, including the current Big Three of Jason Day, Rory McIlroy and Jordan Spieth. (All of the ladies, with rare exception, will play the week after the men.)

As it turns out, skeeters are few and far between in Rio de Janeiro, even on the golf course.



The Olympics vs. The Deere

One has more stars, the other depth (but most are sitting out)

It's not just Jordan Spieth, Rory McIlroy and Jason Day who are sitting out the Olympics at Rio. Actually, more than half of the world's top 300 players aren't playing either the Olympics or the John Deere Classic, even with FedExCup points on offer at the latter. This chart details the surprising numbers game.

The security concerns are understandable – three police were shot, one of them killed, after taking a wrong turn into a gang-controlled favela in the first week of the Olympics – and things like green diving pools that look like the Chicago River on St. Patrick's Day lead one to believe this is the most poorly organized Games since, well, St. Louis.

As the chart to the right indicates, the Olympics aren't well-populated by the current greats of the game. Only 15 of the top 50 players are teeing it up, and merely 28 of the top 100. (The concurrent John Deere Classic is also bereft of the biggest names, save for 22nd-ranked Zach Johnson, its local star, and a handful of others.)

So where is everybody? At home, or on vacation, but not in competition. From the American tour alone, Phil Mickelson, Brooks Koepka, newly-minted PGA champion Jimmy Walker, J.B. Holmes, Jim Furyk, Brandt Snedeker, Scott Piercy, Kevin Kisner, Justin Thomas and Bill Haas are resting up for the Tour's playoffs. Some might play next week at the Wyndham, the last go-round before the race for the big pot of gold at the end of the rainbow at East Lake commences.

The same is true of European tourists. If they're not in Rio, they're not playing, period. Louis Oosthuizen said no thanks to an invitation, as did Charl Schwartzel. So much for the stars of South Africa. Likewise, Australians Adam Scott and Marc Leishman sent their regrets, which opened the door for Marcus Fraser, the leader through 36 holes.

The women's tournament, which runs the following Wednesday through Saturday, will have virtually everyone on hand. That's great for the LPGA and Ladies European Tours, which need

all the publicity they can get for their players. And given the propensity of the top players to rise to the top of the leader board every week, a scrap between New Zealand's Lydia Ko, Canada's Brooke Henderson, Thailand's Aryia Jutanugarn and Americans Stacy Lewis or up-and-comng Gerina Piller can be contemplated.

Indeed, it could be the rising stature of the women's game, from the youth of their stars to their enthusiasm for the tournament, that convinces the IOC to stick with golf despite a rocky

start on the men's side.

What the men need is more guys with former U.S. Open champion Martin Kaymer's attitude. He sees the potential in Olympic golf.

"You know, if you see the other athletes, how much work that they put into this week, and the love that they have for their sport, it's a completely different approach of playing your sport right now," Kaymer said Wednesday. "You gain so much respect for the other athletes and you see your sport a little bit different, too."

Young bucks on the tee

Deere's Peterson uses exemptions to build star power and depth

Years ago, Clair Peterson had the idea. If the established stars are reluctant to come to the John Deere Classic because of the date – usually the week before the Open Championship, a.k.a. the British Open – then go after the young players with great potential for future stardom.

Peterson, the tournament director since 2002, began to offer as many sponsor's exemptions as he could to the kids who might make a splash. In that year, Western Amateur and U.S. Amateur champion Bubba Dickerson and a hopeful named Lucas Glover were among the invitees.

Dickerson never became a star, but Glover would win a U.S. Open. A tradition of trying to identify talent beyond obvious standouts – Tiger Woods nearly won in 1996, playing on an exemption award by previous tournament director Kim Hougham the year he turned pro – had begun.

Two of Peterson's selections in 2012 were amateurs Jordan Spieth and Patrick Rodgers. Spieth finished in a tie for 58th and Rodgers missed the cut, but tied for 15th in 2013, when he was exempted in again.

Spieth was in line for another exemption in

2013, but had been phenomenally successful from the start of the year, so got in on temporary status via his money winnings. He then went and won the tournament in a five-hole playoff with Zach Johnson (the Cedar Rapids standout also given an

exemption in 2002 and 2003) and David Hearn.

That was the big payoff for Peterson's idea. One of his guys came back and won, and, aside from this year, when he decided to not play the Deere after opting out of the Olympics because



it would look funny, the peasonable Spieth is a regular, and a fan favorite, in Silvis.

Among the exemptions this year – Peterson has 12, the extra four awarded because of the competition from the Olympics – are NCAA individual champion Aaron Wise and Illinois graduate Charlie Danielson. Wise, who turned pro shortly after the college finale, comes in as the winner of Canadian MacKenzie Tour tournament a fortnight ago. Both arrive as seasoned veterans of big-time golf thanks to the increased exposure of college competition in the past few years.

Really, the only thing different is not having teammates and people to arrange travel, hotels and the like. Or so they have made it appear.

“I’d say it’s completely different,” Wise said. “We may make it look like it’s easy, but there’s a lot we deal with off the course now that is totally different to what we had to do in college. Golf is a sport where it’s nice and the people you’re playing aren’t bigger or faster or stronger; you’re still going out and you’re playing a golf course.

“Inside the ropes it’s a lot of the same for us.” Danielson agreed.

“It’s just a matter of getting comfortable here, getting used to doing everything on your own, spending some time with different people. But it’s something that we have to embrace. It can be a lonely road out here if you can make it, but I’m looking forward to it, learning as much as I can from other people about myself too, so it’s going to be a fun journey.”

Danielson gradually made an impact on the Illinois program, and that in turn convinced him he could play for money after graduating.

“I got thrown into the lineup my freshman year,” Danielson said of the move by Illinois

coach Mike Small. “I wasn’t expecting it, but I definitely had some ups and downs, just like most freshmen have. You know, I had some good finishes and I had some really bad finishes. I had the summer to kind of regroup, came back sophomore year, had a pretty steady year but nothing great, and then when I started competing on a national level in the summers in my junior and senior year, it was pretty evident that I had the talent. I just had to put everything together and get comfortable, get my life figured out, what I would do, what my plan would be, and everything kind

of fell into place, especially when you start playing good golf.”

This year, Danielson made the cut in Los Angeles after winning a college tournament to get in – but missed it in the U.S. Open – while, after turning pro, has made two of three cuts on the Web.com tour, including a tie for 15th in Utah, which earned him \$10,075, a decent first check. Making the cut at the Deere would boost his coffers even more.

Wise won \$31,500 in Canadian loonies for winning the Syncrude Oil Country Championship, and has cashed to the tune of about \$38,000 Canadian so far. But American dollars would spend even better, and he’s delighted to get the opportunity.

“Obviously it’s hard to make it out on the PGA Tour,” Wise said. “It’s hard for anyone to do that. And all we can do is work as hard as we can and hope tournament directors like these give us that opportunity to go out and show our game on the biggest stage.

“For us to be able to do that here at the John Deere is just an opportunity that you’re not going to get many other places. The tradition you guys have of doing that is absolutely incredible. For you guys to give all the names that Clair mentioned exemptions and help jump-start their careers is awesome, and you don’t know where those guys would be if they didn’t play well. You remember Jordan Spieth holing out of the bunker here, and that kind of kick-started everything for him. You know, things kind of happen for young players at the John Deere.”

They call it magic. Ask Spieth. Or Rodgers, who jumped into contention early in Thursday’s rain-delayed first round. Better yet, ask Peterson.

Here comes Mr. Meyer

Illinois junior beats world No. 2 am Horsfield at Knollwood

This time, there wasn't an impromptu water bottle shower from Illinois teammate Nick Hardy.

This time, there was a bear hug Hardy applied to Dylan Meyer on the 17th green after Sam Horsfield had conceded the 114th Western Amateur championship match at Knollwood Club on Saturday, August 6.

The margin was 3 and 1, largely because Horsfield, after missing the green on the par-3 17th with Meyer on the putting surface and dormie 2, felt it necessary to go for the cup to win the hole and keep the match alive. Horsfield overshot the mark and after one more stroke, took off his hat and offered his hand.

"He was 20 feet away and I had to make it," Horsfield said. "I tried to get aggressive. It didn't work out."

"I didn't expect that," Meyer said. "I thought I'd be putting."

It also might not have been expected that Horsfield, the world No. 2 amateur from Manchester, England via Florida, would surrender the 2-up lead he'd forged after five holes, especially after roaring back from four down on the back nine of his morning semifinal match against Davis Riley with eight holes to play.

But that happened, Horsfield ousting Riley, who scored 5-under 30 on the front, 2 and 1 by winning six of the last seven holes.

Then, four hours later, the reverse happened, elevating Meyer into the upper ranks of American

amateurs. His name now resides on a trophy with the Nicklaus-Woods-Mickelson-Evans crowd.

"He played his butt off," Horsfield said of Meyer.

The turnabout aside, neither Meyer nor Horsfield played particularly brilliant golf. Including the usual concessions, Meyer was 1-under, Horsfield 2-over, with Meyer hitting six of 13 fairways off the tee and just nine of 17 greens in regulation. Horsfield hit seven fairways and 10 greens.

Where the 140-pound Meyer excelled was in overcoming Horsfield's prodigious distance off the tee with a tantalizing short game that outperformed his foe.

"That doesn't bother me at all," Meyer said of being outdriven consistently. "I know my place. I'm not going to be a Dustin Johnson. I'm going to be a Zach Johnson. I'm going to short-game the death out of a golf course."

Meyer's only bogey of the day came on the par-4 fifth, when he failed to get up-and-down from 18 feet to save par, and handed Horsfield his 2-up advantage.

After that, Meyer authored five par saves in seven holes, starting the run by winning the sixth – which Horsfield three-putted for the fourth time in eight competitive rounds – and seventh to square the match. He took the lead on the par-5 10th with his best approach of the day, a saucy wedge to two feet to set up a birdie 4, then ran down a 20-footer to save par on the 11th, punctuated by a fist pump.

"We had the game plan all week of being relentless, just keep on hitting fairways and greens and putting my self in good positions."

"There was no point that I had total control, because anything can happen in the championship match," Meyer said. "But going to 17 tee box I felt I had a pretty good chance."

Horsfield was around the hole all day, but the putts weren't falling on Knollwood's stressed-out greens as they had during stroke play qualifying, when he collected 27 birdies. Now a putt would roll by the hole or lip out rather than topple in.

"I had four lip-outs on the back nine," Horsfield said. "I didn't play bad at all. Dylan played great. It was a couple bad breaks here and there and a couple lipped-out putts."

"It hurts right now. I've never really felt like this in a tournament."

Meyer's putts fell.

"I was rolling the rock this week, as Coach (Mike Small) would say," Meyer said.

Asked what Small would say to him, Meyer said, "Next? Today you won but tomorrow nobody really cares. Enjoy it tonight and tomorrow get back after it."

Meyer is the first Fighting Illini team member, or alum, to win the Western Amateur. He's from Evansville, Ind., and grew up playing public courses like Fendrich and Oak Meadow. More recently, he plays out of posh Victoria National, a frequent host of the Big Ten championship.

"If it wasn't for the support of the city of Evansville and the golf courses back in town, this wouldn't be possible," Meyer said.

Horsfield's semifinal comeback was astonishing. Riley, like Meyer one of five players to survive a sudden-death playoff to make the Sweet Sixteen, was running away with the semifinal match, 4-up after winning the 10th hole with a birdie.

Then Horsfield, whose match play work

wasn't as sharp as his run through the field in stroke play, awakened to win three of the next four holes. He birdied the par-4 11th, birdied the par-4 13th and won the par-4 14th with a par. .

Riley was just 1 up now and reeling. Horsfield squared the match with a birdie 3 on the 15th, won the par-5 16th with a par, and did the same on the par-3 17th. He won six of the last seven holes in the match, a comeback some considered on a par with Tiger Woods' rally from a deficit to beat Chris Tidland in 20 holes in the 1994 quarterfinals at Point O' Woods.

Woods went on to capture the title. Horsfield would not, not with Meyer so motivated.

There was a time when Meyer and match play didn't get along.

That's a long time back.

Meyer, going into his junior year at Illinois, caught on through the good offices of Fighting Illini head coach Mike Small. Since then, he's been stout, and proved it in the quarterfinals, when, despite not hitting the ball quite as well as in his morning match, he dispatched Doug Ghim of Arlington Heights and Texas 5 and 4 to advance to Saturday's semifinal.

"I played pretty solid," Meyer said. "I started to hit the driver good, and Doug, he played solid all the way."

There were two turning points. The first was the combination of Ghim's three-putt green at the third and Meyer's birdie 2 at the fourth, which gave Meyer a 2-up advantage. He would never let it shrink.

"I gave him a little bit of momentum with the three-putt," Ghim said. "I don't feel I played that poorly. Dylan was playing great."

The second was the dagger Meyer threw at Ghim on the 13th hole, a par-4 with the tees

moved up to 309 yards to encourage players to go for the elevated green.

Meyer laid up in the fairway, 91 yards distant. Ghim went for it and came up just short.

Then Meyer took a 52-degree wedge in hand and stuck the approach 18 inches from the cup for a conceded birdie. Ghim chipped four feet past and missed the comebacker to halve the hole, which meant Meyer was dormie 5. When they halved the 14th hole, it was handshake time.

"He did what you have to do in match play," Ghim said of Meyer.

It goes back to the lessons learned from Small, and the experience gained in the NCAA tournament's team match play competition, as

well as the made-for-TV East Lake Cup, the last few years.

"After my match with Aaron (Wise in the NCAA final) I got a big boost in confidence," Meyer said, too modest to mention he beat Wise, the NCAA individual champion, 1 up in the team portion of the proceedings.

"I used to do too much in match play. You can think too far ahead in that. Match play is shot-by-shot. Stroke play, you can plan out your entire round."

Hardy, two weeks after dominating the Illinois Amateur, also made the Sweet Sixteen via a playoff, but fell to Riley, 4 and 2, in his first round match. But he hung around to root Meyer on.

2ND INTERNATIONAL CROWN

American comeback cops the crown

The first day of the second International Crown started for the United States team much as their effort in the first Crown ended.

The competition might have been sponsored by UL, but there was no spark.

The Americans were blanked by England in the opening best-ball matches, just as they had been shut out in the first day's matches at Caves Valley in Maryland two years ago.

That trouble carried through to the Saturday playoff in 2014. The Americans lost it, eliminating them from the Sunday finals.

This time, however, the U.S. squad rallied. Cristie Kerr, Stacy Lewis, Lexi Thompson and Gerina Piller stormed back to win the Crown at Merit Club, picking up three points on the second day, a four-point sweep on the third day, and collecting six points by winning three of four matches on the final day.

Kerr, Lewis and Piller won on Sunday to lift the American total to 13 points to South Korea's 12. Of the other finalists, England and Taiwan tied with 11 and Japan, with eight points, was fifth.

Lewis was out first, playing Japan's Mika Miyazato, but before she closed out her opponent 3 and 2, Piller scored a 4 and 3 victory over Yani Tseng of Taiwan.

“I just couldn’t let myself get comfortable in that spot of being 1 up,” Piller said. “She’s a great player, a prior No. 1 in the world. I just kind of dug deep towards the end and had the mentality of taking no prisoners.”

Lewis also came on at the end to take the measure of Miyazato.

“I wanted to get a lead early and put a number up there for the girls to see,” Lewis said. “I was just trying to fight through it. I found a little something in my swing on 11 and just really striped it from there on in.”

The numbers were posted Sunday, but Lewis thought Saturday night’s talk of planning of the lineup was key, and not because of who played when.

“It really didn’t matter,” Lewis said. “We felt like everybody was playing well so it really didn’t matter where we put our pairings out. We kind of stuck to the order that worked the last two days, which is Gerina and I going out early and then Lexi and Kerr following us and bringing it home. We stuck to that. Lexi’s caddie said, let’s just send it out the same as what we’ve been doing the last two days. So we just kept that momentum going.”

The wins by Piller and Lewis gave the U.S. 11 points, but it wasn’t over. Wins by either Thompson or Kerr would lock up the Crown. And when South Korea’s So Yeon Ryu beat Thompson, Kerr had to win.

Not that she knew beating England’s Mel Reid was a must. Reid became a sentimental favorite when she had to play a Friday best-ball match by herself thanks to Charley Hull’s sudden and brief illness. Reid took the match to the 18th hole before losing 1 up, a remarkable accomplishment.

Kerr finished off Reid on the 16th by a 3 and

2 margin. Only then, when her teammates rushed her, did she know the Crown was theirs.

“Yeah, I didn’t know because I only got a glimpse of a scoreboard very briefly today, and I knew some good things were happening but I didn’t know where Lexi’s match stood, so I just tried to take care of my match,” Kerr said. “It was getting really hot out there. I tried to play as well as I could coming in and tried to make a couple putts too much. I ran them by the hole a little bit there at the end, but yeah, it’s very satisfying.”

Kerr, Lewis and Thompson were on the team that got bounced in 2014, along with Paula Creamer. At least for Lewis, winning was as much a relief at it was a success.

“To be called the best golfing nation I think is pretty satisfying, just to hear that being announced when we’re getting those trophies,” Lewis said. “We had zero points the first day, and we still ended up with the most. It’s just a testament to them and their will to want to win this thing. I was just happy to win my match today and get my first singles win as a professional.

“(I)t’s just so satisfying. I mean, just to hear those words at that announcement. I don’t know what it was like for the rest of them, but that was so cool for me because we’re under constant scrutiny of why aren’t the Americans playing well, why aren’t they winning? I don’t know how else to say it other than it’s just really satisfying.

Aside from Reid’s one-woman show, the best golf of the week came Friday, when Kerr and Thompson were 13-under across 15 holes in beating Thailand’s Ariya Jutanugarn and Pornanong Phatlum en route to a 4 and 3 win.

The 2016 Crown will be played in South Korea, where crowds may double the approximately 25,000 over the four days of play.

67TH ILLINOIS OPEN Pumped up Sainz

Pulls away from Heavens for title

Carlos Sainz Jr. picked up a trophy in his first Illinois Open appearance, back in 2006.

He was low amateur, a good showing for a 20-year-old. That was pleasing, but hardly his ultimate goal.

On Wednesday, July 20, at Royal Fox Country Club, Sainz did himself one better, breaking away in the final round to win the 67th Illinois Open by five strokes with a record score of 17-under-par 197.

“It’s big,” Sainz said. “I’ve wanted to win this the last four or five years since I turned pro.”

He succeeded in grand fashion, firing his second straight 6-under 65, this one bogey free, at Royal Fox to go with an opening 5-under 67 at Royal Hawk Country Club. The back-to-back 65s for 130 don’t add up to a record – David Cooke, the winner last year at Royal Melbourne, still owns that at 128 – but Sainz wrested the tournament scoring and relation-to-par marks away from Cooke in style.

With one bogey in his last 45 holes, Sainz played with the demeanor of a confident man. With family and friends from nearby Elgin on hand, he walked on the first tee with a four-stroke lead and birdied four of the first six holes, including a 40-footer up a ridge on the par-4 third hole. That expanded his lead to five strokes over eventual runner-up Christian Heavens of Fairview Heights and to six over Chicagoan Brad Hopfinger, who took third.

Birds on the fourth and sixth followed, and it was then only a matter of how

many rather than who. The dagger came on the 16th, when he punctuated a curling 25-footer for a birdie 3 with a fist pump and a celebratory walk to the cup.

“Those were bonuses,” Sainz said. But he also said, “You have to believe they’re going in.”

Sainz believed deeply. With his mother Rose as his nominal caddie, Sainz played his best golf since winning a mini-tour tournament in Florida earlier this year.

Since then, he’s played good but not great golf, working on his swing and getting into tournaments when he could. It’s tough to keep one’s confidence intact during such a stretch, especially after losing one’s PGA Tour card.

“Confidence is a lot in this game,” Sainz said. “The guys on tour, they say that when you’re playing well, you have to feel you can win the tournament.”

That’s what Sainz is aiming for on a regular basis.

“I felt good all the way,” Sainz said. “I knew they had to come catch me today.”

The victory, more than the \$17,500 first prize, will boost that confidence when he jumps on the Mackenzie Tour, the PGA Tour’s Canadian operation, for the weeks leading to the Tour’s qualifying tournaments. The better he plays in Canada, the fewer “Q School” stages he has to play in.

Heavens’ 5-under 66 for a total of 12-under 202 – which would have won all but four 54-hole Illinois Opens – was built on a fast start, the highlight a 10-foot eagle putt on the sixth hole after a brilliant approach. But Heavens could never get closer than four strokes, that after birdies on the 10th and 11th holes, which Sainz parred, and again after a deuce on the 17th.

Hopfinger was similarly climbing uphill all

day. His best run was a stretch of three birdies on five holes to start the back nine, which moved him to 11-under. Sainz was 16 under by the 14th hole.

In finishing fourth, Northbrook’s Nick Hardy accomplished what Sainz did a decade ago, capturing the low amateur award. Wednesday’s 3-un-

der 68 put Hardy at 9-under 205.

“I had nothing to lose, so I went to make as many birdies as I could,” Hardy said. “I played all right. I did not putt like I normally do this whole tournament. That’s kind of what held me back and why I didn’t finish like Carlos did. That’s golf.

“Last week they were going in. This week

they weren't."

Hardy made 15 birdies in three rounds, but missed birdie attempts, rather than his six bogeys, held him back.

Hardy noted that St. Charles Country Club, where he routed the field in the Illinois Amateur, was dissimilar to Royal Fox, a Dick Nugent layout opened in 1990.

"The greens are different, the way they roll and react to shots," Hardy said.

Amateurs Kevin Flack of Belvidere and Brandon Mounce of El Paso and Mistwood pro Andy Mickelson tied for fifth at 7-under 207. Flack's 65 moved him up from a tie for 25th entering the round.

Royal Hawk head professional Brian Carroll,

who with Heavens was a first round co-leader, finished in a tie for 12th at 4-under 210 after a 1-under 70.

Illinois head men's coach Mike Small and recruit Tommy Kuhl, a junior at downstate Morton High, played in a late threesome and ended up among those tied for ninth at 5-under 209 after 71s.

Hardy routs Illinois Amateur field

The numbers looked like a misprint. A total of 260. A finish at 28 under par.

Since when did the Illinois Amateur turn into the old Buick Open?

When Nick Hardy was in complete control of his game, that's when.

The native of Northbrook and junior at Illinois, close in the last two Illinois Amateurs, grabbed the 86th edition by the throat and didn't let go until he could raise the Louis Emmerson Trophy high.

Hardy laid waste to fashionable St. Charles Country Club from July 19-21, scoring 64-65 on the par-72 circuit in the final two rounds. That's 129. That almost doesn't add up.

Neither does 260, but that's what Hardy scored. And he played every hole – with birdies on 32 of them. The 72-hole aggregate surpassed Bob Zender's 270, scored in 1971, by 10 strokes. The eye-popping 28-under mark beat the 13-under-par mark set by former PGA Tour member Jerry Haas in 1984. But Hardy came up short in the quest for one record. Rob Grube beat the field by 11 strokes in 2006.

No biggie, Hardy said.

"Going into the final round, I didn't care if I won by one or if I won by 10," said Hardy, who was third last year and second in 2014. "I just wanted to win. I kept battling out there all day and

it happened to be 10. It means a lot to me."

Defending champion Tim "Tee-K" Kelly of Wheaton was second – or leader of the A flight – at 18-under 270, a stroke ahead of joint third place finishers Charlie Netzel (Western Springs) and Brian Ohr (Northbrook), the 36-hole leader. Hardy, believe it or not, didn't grab the lead for good until the middle of the back nine in the third round.

Then, he ran away from the field.

Kelly, recently graduated from Ohio State, could only shake his head at Hardy's exploits, calling his score "video game numbers."

"If someone would have told me on Monday night that I would shoot 18-under, I would have probably said I'd win again," Kelly told the CDGA's Matt Baylor. "Sometimes, someone just brings their stuff and you can't beat it."

Ohr had matched the course record with a 9-under 63 in the first round. Hardy was two back at 65. The race was on.

"I think it was a perfect storm, perfect scoring conditions. It's hot, so the ball was going far and off the tee it was jumping," Kelly said. "There wasn't much wind and the fairways were perfect, plus six or seven guys were out there playing their best golf."

Hardy began the 36-hole final day grind a shot behind Ohr, and it wasn't until the 12th hole of the morning round where Hardy took the lead. He then birdied the par-3 13th while Ohr double

bogeyed, his tee shot hitting the cart path and went out of bounds. In a flash, Hardy led by four.

That was like waving the old Soviet flag at a bull. Hardy charged. He birdied the last three holes of Round 3 and splashed seven more birdies on his Round 4 card, the last a tap-in bird after lipping out a 30-foot eagle putt. (Hey, nobody's perfect.)

Everyone else was playing for second place.

"I never really let go from there," Hardy said of the 13th hole. "I didn't really make any mistakes after that. That was definitely the turning point."

Aside from his accomplishments at Illinois, Hardy's had a fine amateur career, including back-to-back U.S. Open appearances and a pair of Sweet Sixteen showings in the Western Amateur.

"It's nice to finally get the monkey off my back, get it done and win this tournament," Hardy said. "I've been really close the past couple years. I had my best stuff, that's for sure."

Trent Wallace (Joliet) rounded out the top-five finishers at 16-under 272. Sixth-place finisher Patrick Flavin (Highwood) at 15-under and Jake Erickson (Springfield) at 14-under in seventh also beat the old Illinois Am record in relation to par. Raymond Knoll (Naperville), the 2014 champion, Kyle Slattery (Rockford) and Daniel Hudson (Western Springs) rounded out the top 10.

Other notables making the cut included 2012 champ Quinn Prchal (Glenview) finishing in a tie for 11th along with two-time winner Todd Mitchell (Bloomington). Peoria's Talon Supak, who carded his first career hole-in-one during the first round, finished 2-under par in a tie for 18th. The low 20 finishers at this year's event earned exemptions from qualifying for the 87th Illinois Amateur next year at Calumet Country Club.

Clubmaker supreme Mendralla dead at 86

Before Bob Mendralla came along, nobody knew who designed modern golf clubs. Occasionally a club pro would have a hand in, but for the most part, clubs were designed by faceless craftsmen at the big manufacturers, working in anonymity.

Mendralla, who died July 20 aged 86, changed all that. He, working at Wilson Sporting Goods for 57 years – most of it in the golf division – became the public face of the River Grove firm's famed skunk works.

"Bob was the first guy in this industry who put a face and a name to club-making," Titleist's Bob Vokey told Canadian writer Rick Young at the PGA Show a few years ago. "He's the guy who blazed the trail for a lot of us to do what we're doing today."

Who used his clubs? Almost everybody. How's this lineup for Wilson Staff clubs: Arnold Palmer, Billy Casper, Sam Snead, Ben Crenshaw, Hale Irwin, Payne Stewart and Patty Berg for starters.

And, probably, you.

The famed 8802 putter? Mendralla's.

The Dynapower wedges? Mendralla's.

Adjustable swing weights are all the rage today. Mendralla did it first. Likewise the elastic inserts on the backs of irons. The gentleman was a genius.

Mendralla was inducted into the Illinois Golf Hall of Fame and the Club Makers Hall of Fame in 2003.
